History of the San Fernando Valley Chapter with Conventions as Mileposts

The San Fernando Valley Chapter started in 1961 as a daughter chapter of the National Smooth Dancers in Los Angeles, bringing the organization to eleven chapters. The San Fernando Valley Chapter hosted two conventions in quick succession, the first in 1965 and then again in 1971. After that, perhaps because of dwindling membership, it did not put on an annual convention for twenty years.

The chapter seemed to see itself as a social club that danced, and had some “folksy” traditions. For example, the monthly dances ended promptly at 11pm, and everyone would gather to enjoy home-made cakes, and social pressure ensured they were made always “from scratch” and never from a mix.

Around 1980, then president Allan Scott arranged with the Sloan and Sloan Studio, newly moved to Glendale, to hold the SFV monthly parties there. As time went by, Sheila Sloan noticed that the chapter needed members, and encouraged her students to join the Smooth Dancers chapter. By 1990, the chapter increased its size enough that it was no longer in danger of falling below the 25 member minimum size and having to fold. It was also large enough they could again undertake running the annual convention.

In 1991, the San Fernando Valley Chapter hosted the NSD Convention. With such a long time since they had put on a convention, the chapter had no experience to draw on. They pressed on, and chose for their convention venue the Hyatt Westlake Plaza Hotel in Westlake Village (now the Hyatt Regency). The venue could not accommodate more than 250 attendees, and the chapter had to turn away a few who wanted to attend.

While preparing for the Convention an artist friend of President Bill Lawrence designed a logo for the chapter, one that the chapter still uses. The convention theme was *Through the Looking Glass*, the many striking costumes were reminiscent of *Alice in Wonderland*, including the Mad Hatter, Queen of Hearts, pages, and more. The costumes were possible because Barbara Gibson had a fabric business and donated all the materials. When it came time to put on the advertising “teaser” at the Bakersfield Board Meeting, it was not a “skit.” Instead the members were to form a circle on the floor, and while the DJ played the *Can Can* the members were to dance a version of tango to it. At the convention, the professional couple were Johan and Nadia Eftedal, already the Norwegian Professional Latin champions. They became European Professional Latin Champions in 1992 and 1993 and won the Blackpool Open Professional Latin Championship in 1993. They took the Open Latin championship title in many countries like the U.K, Germany France and others.

Through the '90s, the chapter continued to bring in new members, rising to 60 members. But many of its older cadre had passed away, including the 1991 convention organizers. When it came time to host the 1998 Convention, again the task fell to inexperienced members. They signed a contract with the Bonaventure hotel in downtown Los Angeles, and decided on the theme, *Hollywood Holiday*.

With less than a year to go before the event, chapter members became largely disinterested in the Convention and their participation was waning. Progress was stalling and the project was heading toward failure, so the president, John Pennock, and his wife Vivian stepped in to organize the event. Problems later arose, like some in other chapters questioning the safety of downtown Los Angeles. Then, shortly before the event, their professional couple, Canadian professional Latin champion Jean Marc Généaux and Mireille Villieux announced that for personal reasons they could not come. Fortunately Jean Marc arranged for his cousin Alain Doucet and Anik Jolicoeur-Doucet to perform instead. It turned out the new couple were a fortuitous choice, great dancers as well as personable. They would soon be world professional ten-dance champions and retain that title for four successive years. In spite of concern about the downtown venue for the convention, the hotel had an interesting, modern feel, the attendees had fun and in the end the books ended up in the black.

The next time they hosted a convention, in 2005, John and Vivian Pennock again were the organizers and selected the theme *Fantasy Adventures*. They evaluated several hotels and settled on the J.W. Marriott in Palm Desert. They hired Canadian champions Pierre Allaire and Mireille Villieux to do the shows and to judge. Preparations this time included preliminary meetings with the subcommittees to negotiate costs, and establishment of strict budgets for each. The chapter's very low bank balance (well under \$1000) likely prompted those budgets, but they were a big factor in the financial success of the endeavor. The chapter gratefully accepted assistance from other chapters, San Diego for their loudspeakers and Bakersfield for audio components needed in an emergency. The convention was a huge success, with acclaim from those attending, and it was quite profitable as well. The only major negative response came from some who had registered late and ended up with rooms that were a long distance from the ballroom in the sprawling hotel.

Starting from before the convention and especially after, the chapter experienced an ongoing crisis. It was fast losing membership, with some members transferring to the Los Angeles Chapter and others even dropping out of NSD altogether. Most of the problem was dissension, sometimes heated, about enforcing traditions at the monthly dances. Membership dropped into the 30s, and the rate of decline boded chapter membership dropping below the minimum size of 25 members. Only by 2009 did membership again start to rise, thanks partly to adopting new policies and partly to active recruiting by Joan Robinson.

Around this time, the chapter had to move out of the Sloan Studio. In the summer of 2006, they moved to the Moose Lodge next door, which unlike Sloan's, had air conditioning. At the Moose, the chapter changed their party to Sunday afternoons since the Moose used Saturday evenings for their own events. By the end of 2008, the Moose hierarchy decided that renting to outside organizations like the NSD chapter was against Moose regulations, and they in any case needed to remodel the facility. The chapter moved to the Dancemore studio, a converted warehouse in Van Nuys, and very quickly moved to another converted warehouse across the street, the Hollywood Dance Academy. The chapter remained with the Hollywood Dance Academy, and continued to do so in April 2016 when the studio moved to its present location on Van Nuys Boulevard in Van Nuys.

In 2012, it was again SFV's turn to host a convention, and Joan Robinson Mark Emanuelli were co-organizers. They decided to return to the J.W. Marriott in Palm Desert with the theme *Dancing through the Holidays*. They used much of what made the 2005 event such a success, starting with the 2005 Convention budget, and drew on experiences from 2005. But this time they engaged local professionals for the show and judging. And there were innovations. They ensured single women could dance by having line dancing and more mixers, and hiring dance hosts to dance with single women (an NSD first). Also new were a "grab and go" counter for lunches, and a flash mob. The event ran smoothly partly thanks to Mark Emanuelli's having scheduled the program down to the minute. Interestingly, the chapter prepared for this convention essentially without meetings and relied on email. This convention, too, was a success, with attendees raving about the fun they had. The 2012 convention was also profitable, even more so than the 2005 convention.

Hosting the 2019 Convention fell to the San Fernando Valley Chapter. Mark Emanuelli and Joan Robinson again took on the roles of co-organizers. A contract with Marriott Warner Center in Woodland Hills ensured that the venue would be relatively close by. The theme this time was *Night and Day*, with daytime events being work themes and evening events exotic dance venue themes. The advertising performance was a series of very short dance skits depicting those motifs.
